

\$10,000 Found

It is said the money was found inside a piece of luggage.

Dorothy Hunt, 52, of Potomac, Md., who was killed in the Friday crash.

Her husband, Howard Hunt, Jr., is one of seven who were indicted by a federal grand jury Sept. 15 in connection with the Watergate incident. He is a former consultant to Charles W. Colson, White House counsel.

Mrs. Hunt apparently was coming to Chicago to visit a cousin, Harold C. Carlstein, of suburban Elmhurst.
