WATERGATE GOOF — We recently obtained access to Watergate defendant Eugenio Martinez' diary and reported that "the date 6-21-72 was scribbled three times by different pens, with initials following each date," We suggested that the initials, through "it may be merely a coincidence," could signify Robert Odle; Herbert Porter and James McCord, all former Nixon campaign aides who have figured in the Watergate testimony.
