2 for Series on Watergate

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30 (AP) - The Newspaper Guild has announced that Carl Bernstein and Bob Woodward of The Washington Post were winners of the Guild's 1972 Heywood Broun award for their series on the Watergate break-in and bugging of Democratic National Headquarters.

The two reporters received a \$1,000 check and a citation for the award, named after the Guild's founder and first president.

The Post series was chosen from among 91 entries. Three entries cited for honorable mention were:
