**Student Is Suspended
Over Watergate Role**

PROVO, Utah, Feb. 6—
Thomas J. Gregory, one of
the Government's chief wit-
nesses in the Watergate trial,
was suspended as a Brigham
Young University student to-
day for his activities as a
political spy.

Mr. Gregory, a senior at
the university, testified about
his role during the trial of
the seven men accused of
bugging the Democratic Na-
tional Headquarters last
June.

A university announce-
ment said that Mr. Gregory
would be barred for at least
two semesters because his
"undercover activities, while
ostensibly working for Presi-
dential candidates, were in
violation of the B.Y.U. code
of honor, which requires that
students must be 'honest in
all behavior.'"

Mr. Gregory had con-
ducted his espionage while
on an off-campus study proj-
ect in political science. The
announcement said that he
had been given a failing grade
and would receive no credit
for the project.
