RULING ON GIFT DATA MADE IN VESCO CASE

Evidence concerning a secret cash contribution of \$200,000 to President Nixon's re-election campaign, said to have been made by Robert L. Vesco, was provisionally excluded yesterday from the securities case against the financier.

In an order issued in United States District Court here, Judge Charles, E. Stewart Jr. ruled that the contribution could not be discussed in court proceedings against Mr. Vesco except as it might relate to alleged violations of securities laws and efforts to protect the assets of International Controls, the New Jersey electronics concern Mr. Vesco once headed.

The Securities and Exchange Commission last November charged Mr. Vesco and 40 others with looting \$224-million from four mutual funds. The Government agency is seeking to determine if the funds belonged to Mr. Vesco or to the company.
