An official of the International Telephone and Telegraph Co. yesterday denied suggestions by col-umnist Jack Anderson that the company could have hired the Watergate team to break into the Chilean embassy.

Anderson quoted a report by Jerry Levinson, a Senate subcommittee aide, that ITT might have employed the men who broke into the Democratic Headquarters at the Watergate offce building.

"The allegations contained therein are completely inac-curate and untrue," declared ITT vice president R. G. Bateson.

"In Mr. Levinson's own reported words . case outlined in this memorandum is circumstantial and there is no hard evidence of ITT involvement.'

"ITT never hired E. sumptions and gross factual Howard Hunt or any so-called Mission Impossible Team. There is no link between ITT and any of the Watergate defendants or break-ins of the Chilean em-bassy or Chilean diplomats' residences.
