Lie Detector Test About Watergate

Washington

Former presidential special counsel Charles W. Colson took a lie detector test last week, the results of which support his sworn statements that he had no advance knowledge of the Watergate bugging, according to reliable legal sources.

The sources said that Colson voluntarily took the test.

The lie detector test was done privately at Colson's invitation.

The Washington Post reported on March 29 that convicted Watergate conspirator James W. McCord Jr. testified before the Senate Watergate Committee that he had the impression from "secondhand" information received from fellow conspirators that Colson had advance knowledge of the Watergate bugging.
