Demos Call for

New Watergate

Prosecutor

Frankfort, Ky.

National Democratic party chairman Robert Strauss yesterday called for the appointment of a special and impartial prosecutor in the grand jury investigation of the Watergate case.

"The public deserves and will accept nothing less than the full truth," he said. "An independent, respected and impartial special prosecutor must be appointed to move forward the grand jury proceedings."

Strauss suggested someone such as Supreme Court Chief Justice Warren Burger or the president of the American Bar Association should appoint "a prosecutor not obligated or tied to those already named, accused or implicated, nor one apt to be influenced by those yet to be discovered, if any there be."
