Shriver Urges

A Prosecutor

For Watergate

MONTGOMERY (Ala.) — (AP) — R. Sargent Shriver, 1972 Democratic vice presidential nominee, has called for President Nixon to ask five retired Supreme Court justices to appoint a special prosecutor who would have jurisdiction over "every aspect" of the Watergate case.

In a speech prepared for delivery at the annual Kennedy-Johnson-King dinner last night, Shriver suggested that former Chief Justice Earl Warren and former Justices Stanley Reed, Tom Clark, Charles Whittaker and Arthur Goldberg serve on a panel that would appoint the special prosecutor.

"The Watergate investigation must no longer be a family affair," the former candidate said.

Shriver said the prosecutor would be "easy to describe, but hard to find."
