
THEIMPORTANCE and influence of top staff members in the scheme of things at the White House was captured in these exclusive pictures by Fred J. Maroon who worked in the White House for almost a year during 1970 and 1971, photographing leading personalities in the Nixon administration.

Maroon's project, put together in collaboration with author Allen Drury, was a portrait of the living White House, its day-to-day affairs, the dutles of key people in the various departments and how they carried them out. The book was published by Doubleday at the end of 1971 with the title "Courage and Hesitation."


