## G.O.P. AIDE TESTIFIES **ON FUNDING RALLIES**

WASHINGTON, May 1 (UPI) -Robert C. Odle Jr., director of administration for President Nixon's re-election committee,

Nixon's re-election committee, has testified that he spent \$3,000 to \$4,000 in campaign cash to help organize demon-strations in support of Mr. Nix-on's order in 1972 for the min-ing of Haiphong harbor. According to Mr. Odle's deposition in the Democrats' \$6.4-million civil damage suit against the Finance Committee to Re-elect the President, its Black Vote Division also re-ceived about \$2,000 to help or-ganize a rally on Capitol Hill in support of the mining. The General Accounting Of-fice said Friday that the com-mittee had not reported the expenditures as required by the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971. Mr. Odle testified that he re-caived the cach from Harbort

Act of 1971. Mr. Odle testified that he re-ceived the cash from Herbert L. Porter, scheduling director for the re-election committee, about the time of the mining of the harbors last May 8. "I have a recollection that the director of our Black Vote Division, Paul Jones, received about \$2,000 to bring people into the area to rally at a Capi-tol building in support of that action," Mr. Odle said. "He used that to pay for the buses and some of the food and that sort of thing."
