

Finch Offers to Help Nixon on Reorganization

LOS ANGELES, May 1
(AP)—Robert H. Finch, a former Presidential counselor, has offered to help President Nixon reorganize the White House staff, a spokesman for Mr. Finch said Tuesday.

"He's willing and anxious to do anything to help," the spokesman, Zan Thompson, said of Mr. Finch. "If he is asked to serve on the reorganization, he will do that. However, it would be short-term only."

Mr. Finch has been in touch with the White House several times in the last few days, the spokesman added.

Mr. Finch, one of the President's oldest and closest political friends, served as Mr. Nixon's first secretary of Health, Education and Welfare and then became a Presidential counselor.
