

City Investigation Deputy
To Aid Watergate Inquiry

David M. Dorsen has resigned as first deputy commissioner in the city's Investigation Department to serve as assistant chief counsel to the Senate committee investigating the Watergate affair.

Mr. Dorsen, a 37-year-old graduate of Harvard College and its Law School, served as an assistant United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York from 1964 to 1969, when he joined the city department.
