- President Nixon has chosen Gen. Alexander M. Haig Jr. to be interim chief of the White House staff, it was learned today.

The 49-year-old Haig has been army vice chief of staff since January and had served as chief deputy to Nixon's national security ad-

viser, Henry A. Kissinger.
