The Orpheus Discount Record Store in Washington, D.C., offered records at 49 cents to anyone who was formerly a White House adviser, or subpoenaed or indicted by the Senate investigating committee, or Jack Anderson. A store spokesman said Anderson was the first to arrive with several children, went home with ten records, and he [was] followed [by] a woman indicted in the take-over of the Bureau of Indian Affairs last week. So many people, in fact, under those categories came and bought so many records that the store [has] since limited its offer to three records per sale customer. That sale was known as the Richard Kleindienst Memorial Sale.
