## Watergate Case Newsmen Hailed by Justice Stewart

WASHINGTON, May 9 (AP) WASHINGTON, May 9 (AP) — Associate Justice Potter Stewart of the Supreme Court credited Wednesday the "dedi-cation and persistence" of two newspaper reporters in bringing to light aspects of the Water-gate scandal.

gate scandal. Justice Stewart's remarks, apparently the first public ref-erence to the scandal by a member of the Court, did not

include specifics. Instead, he raised the issue in telling members of the Yale Club of Washington that "really important" ideals and aspira-tions of past generations have been carried forward by the present generation.

After citing participation by young persons in the civil rights movement and in halting United States participation in the ground war in Indochina, Justice Stewart said; "And I remind you that it was two very young newspaper report. very young newspaper report-ers whose dedication and perers whose dedication and per-sistence recently served to un-cover serious wrongdoing in American political life." He referred to Carl Bernstein, 29 years old, and Bob Wood-ward, 30, of The Washington Post.
