

Senate Votes for a Voice  
On Presidential Advisers

WASHINGTON, May 9 (AP) —The Senate passed today a measure that would require Senate confirmation of appointees to key positions as Presidential aides.

The bill, passed 72 to 21 and sent to the House, called for confirmation of those appointed by a President to fill the White House staff posts of Executive director, Domestic Council, which is vacant with the post formerly held by John D. Ehrlichman; executive secretary, National Security Council, now held by Henry A. Kissinger; executive director, Council of International Economic Policy, now held by Peter M. Flanigan.
