San Francisco Mayor Joseph L. Alioto said yes-terday the Watergate scandal lends credence at last to his contention the Nixon administration tar-geted him for "political persecution" in 1969-72. "I knew all those bums be-

fore they became celebri-ties," said Alioto, referring to persons implicated in var-

ious investigations. "Men involved in my litigation are involved in my nu-gation are involved with burglars, bribers, obstruc-tion of justice, threatening people, making up stories, burglarizing psychiatricity burglarizing psychiatrist's offices.

"That whole picture," Alioto continued in a telephone interview from Paris, where he is nearing the end of a five-week European vacation, "makes plausible my original charge that I was the victim of political persecution."

It was administration politics, Alioto said, that led to a Look magazine article linking him to the Mafia, which he disproved in court; federal bribery and mail fraud charges stemming from attorney fee splitting, which were dismissed by a judge, and a civil suit involving the same fee splitting, which he won.
