Krogh Agrees to Testify
In Ellsberg Case Break-In

LOS ANGELES, May 11 (AP) —A former White House aide ordered a break-in at the office of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist has agreed to testify before a county grand jury independently without the promise of immunity from prosecution, a deputy district attorney says.

Egil Krogh Jr., who resigned Wednesday as Under Secretary of Transportation, agreed yesterday to testify at the grand jury hearings scheduled for June 5 to 8, Deputy District Attorney Richard Hecht said.

Though Mr. Hecht indicated that Mr. Krogh had not been promised immunity, he said he was prepared to offer such protection to E. Howard Hunt, the Watergate conspirator if he testified before the grand jury. Mr. Hecht said that Hunt was "on the verge" of agreeing to testify.
