The White House yesterday softened its broad in-

day softened its broad instructions on when present or former presidential aides should refuse to answer questions on grounds of executive privilege.

Acting White House counsel Leonard Garment told newsmen the guidelines he drafted recently won't be allowed to hide wrongdoing, cant be legally enforced, are only for general guidance and don't "represent any attempt to rstrict or suppress information."
