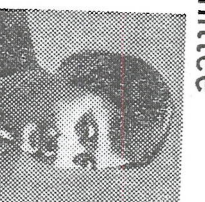
Central Figures in the Watergate Hearings



SAM J. ERVIN JR., Democrat of North Carolina, committee chairman . . . 76 years old, the third oldest Senator . . . a portly, white-haired man with a heavy Southern accent, fond of illustrating his points with anecdotes and quotations from the Bible and Shakespeare . . . A former judge considered the Senate's leading expert on the Constitution, conservative but a staunch civil libertarian.



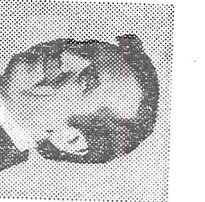
HERMAN E. TALMADGE, Democrat of Georgia . . . 59. A quiet power in the Senate, as chairman of Agriculture Committee and ranking Democrat on the Finance Committee . . . Son of Eugene Tolmudge, tempestuous former Governor of Georgia . . . Regarded as one of the smartest Senators . . . sees his role as the Watergate committee as that of a juror.



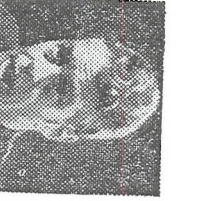
DANIEL K. INOUE, Democrat of Hawaii . . . 48, of Japanese descent . . . a member of Congress since Hawaii became a state . . . lost his right arm in World War II . . . A protégé of Sam Rayburn and Lyndon Johnson and a favorite of the Senate Majority leader Mike Mansfield . . . Key-note speaker at 1968 Democratic convention . . . wants to be Majority leader someday.



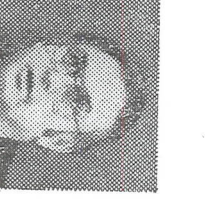
JOSEPH M. MONTOYA, Democrat of New Mexico . . . 57 . . . Member of prominent New Mexico family, has held public office since he was 21, but not widely known outside his own state . . . conducted hearings this year on operations of Internal Revenue Service . . . A liberal voting record on domestic issues and an early opponent of Vietnam war.



HOWARD H. BAKER JR., Republican of Tennessee, ranking Republican on committee . . . 47 . . . father and mother were both in Congress, and Baker is married to daughter of Everett Dirksen . . . considered a potential President and Vice President . . . acted promise from Republican leadership that he would not be expected to take a partisan line in hearings.



EDWARD J. GURNEY, Republican of Florida . . . 59 . . . Native of Maine, graduate of Harvard Law School, moved to Florida in 1948 . . . limps as result of war injury . . . Has used position on Judiciary Committee to defend Nixon Administration in controversial hearings . . . Congressional work . . . up for re-election in 1947.



LOWELL P. WEICKER, Republican of Connecticut . . . 41 . . . Physically the biggest man in Senate . . . The most outspoken member of Watergate committee, he has placed blame deep within White House . . . Has opposed Administration on many domestic and foreign issues . . . Yale Graduate, son of wealthy industrialist.

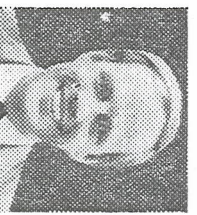

HARRY ROBBINS HALDEMAN ... Was President's chief of staff with full control over who saw Mr. Nixon and who didn't ... Associates of Mr. Dean have said he is ready to testify that Mr. Haldeman and Mr. Ehrlichman worked to cover-up the Watergate scandal ... Resigned last week with Presidential praise.



JOHN DANIEL EHRLICHMAN ... 48 ... was President's top domestic adviser ... Conceded that he ordered a secret White House investigation of Daniel Ellsberg that resulted in a break-in at the office of Mr. Ellsberg's psychiatrist by two Watergate conspirators ... Denies he led them-F.B.I. director L. Patrick Gray to destroy files ... Resigned April 30, with Presidential praise.

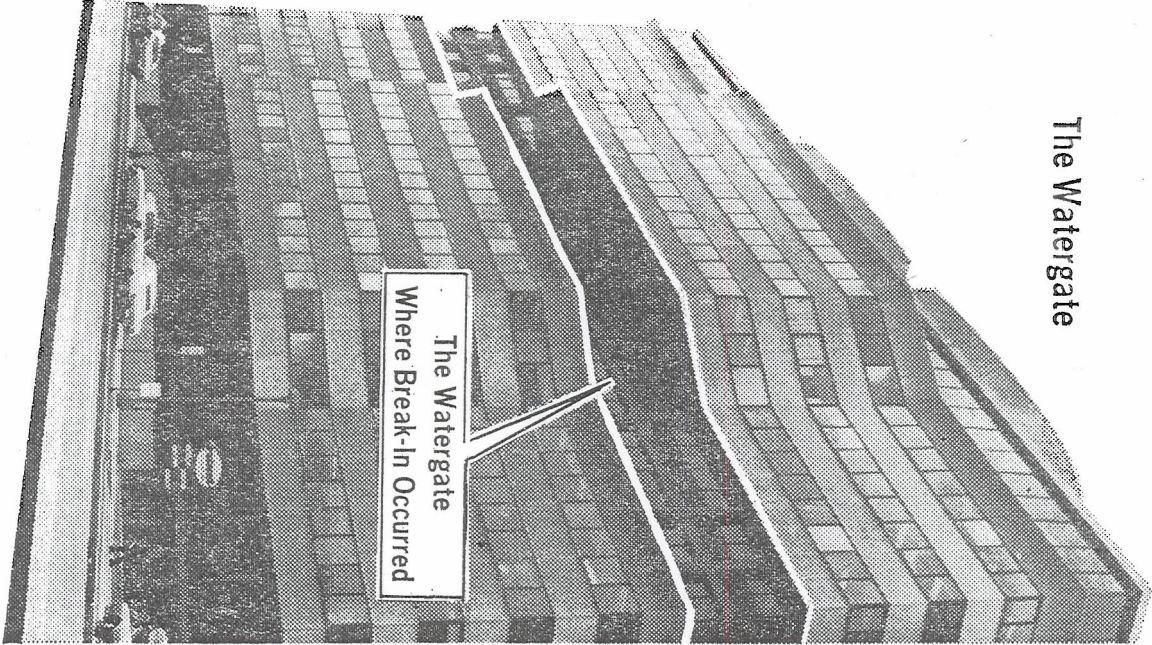


JOHN WESLEY DEAN 3D ... 34 ... Chief Counsel to the President in the summer of 1972 and reported no one then at White House was involved ... Allegedly instructed F.B.I. chief Gray to destroy files of a Watergate conspirator ... Issued statement saying he would not be made a "scapegoat" ... Forced to resign by the President on April 30.



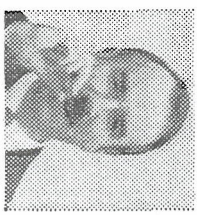
CHARLES WENDELL COLSON ... 41 ... Was Special Counsel at White House until leaving in March for private law practice ... Known as Nixon's "Hatchet Man" ... Watergate conspirator E. Howard Hunt worked as a consultant to him in 1972 ... says he detector proves he had no advance knowledge of Watergate bugging.

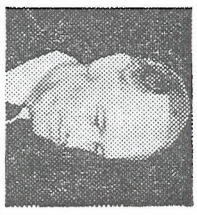

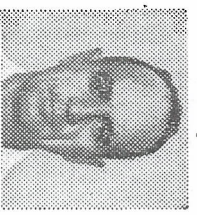
Bugging Conspirators



GEORGE GORDON LIDDY ... 42 ... Convicted Watergate conspirator who refused to testify before the Watergate grand jury ... Former F.B.I. agent ... Worked for Mr. Ehrlichman in 1971. ... Left to become general counsel to the Committee for the Re-Election of the President ... Four months on Nixon finance committee ... Sent to have burglarized office of Ellsberg psychiatrist.



EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT JR. ... 54 ... A former C.I.A. agent who pleaded guilty in the Watergate break-in trial ... Served as White House consultant to his friend, Mr. Colson ... Linked with G. Gordon Liddy in rifling, ordered by White House, of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatric records ... wife died in plane crash last December with \$10,000 in \$100 bills in her purse.



JAMES WALTER MCCORD ... 55 JR. ... A 20-year veteran of the C.I.A., arrested for breaking into Democratic headquarters while he was security coordinator ... Pleaded guilty to conspiracy, burglary and eavesdropping for his role in the break-in at the Democratic headquarters ... He was security coordinator for the Nixon re-election to CIA agent Hunt in Buy committee ... Remained silent until after his conviction ... On March 21, he offered to tell all, generating new disclosures from others about White House involvement.



BERNARD L. BARKER ... 55 ... Pleaded guilty to conspiracy, burglary and eavesdropping for his role in the break-in at the Democratic headquarters ... He was security coordinator for the Nixon re-election to CIA agent Hunt in Buy committee ... Remained silent until after his conviction ... On March 21, he offered to tell all, generating new disclosures from others about White House involvement.

Committee for the Re-Election of the President



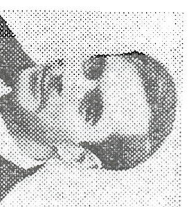
JOHN NEWTON MITCHELL . . . 59 . . . Was one of President Nixon's oldest advisers during his term as Attorney General . . . Was director of Nixon re-election committee . . . Indicted by a grand jury in New York investigating financial dealings of Robert L. Vesco, on charges of conspiring to obstruct justice, conspiring to defraud the United States, and perjury.



MAURICE HUBERT STANS . . . 65 . . . Was chief fund raiser for 1968 and 1972 Nixon campaigns . . . According to testimony in Watergate trial, he kept fund of \$350,000 to \$700,000 from campaign contributions in his safe, some of which was used for bugging operation . . . Indicted on charges of conspiring to obstruct justice, to defraud the United States, and of perjury by New York grand jury.



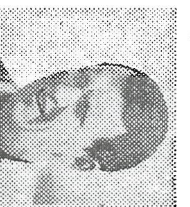
JEB STUART MAGRUDER . . . 38 . . . Was a Haldeman aide . . . Briefly headed Nixon re-election committee before becoming deputy under John Mitchell in April, 1971 . . . Reportedly informed prosecutors that he discussed plans for the bugging with Liddy, Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Dean at meetings earlier this year . . . Says he expects to be convicted and go to jail.



HUGH W. SLOAN . . . 32 . . . Was a White House assistant and treasurer of Nixon re-election committee . . . Admitted in court he gave \$200,000 to Liddy, but contends he did not know what the money was used for . . . Said he "verified" payments with Mr. Stans, who had verified them with Mr. Mitchell.



LOUIS PATRICK GRAY 3d . . . 57 . . . as acting director of the F.B.I. supervised F.B.I. investigation into the Watergate affair . . . Allowed John Dean to be present at F.B.I. interviews of White House officials . . . Gave F.B.I. Watergate files to White House . . . Destroyed some files reportedly at suggestion of Mr. Dean and Mr. Ehrlichman . . . After acknowledging this he resigned.



HERBERT WARREN KALMBACH . . . 51 . . . Was the President's personal lawyer until last week . . . Was associate finance chairman of 1968 Nixon campaign under Maurice H. Stans . . . Controlled \$500,000 secret campaign fund . . . Admits paying \$30,000 to \$40,000 to political saboteur Donald Segretti . . . Told investigators he destroyed campaign finance records.
