DATA SUBPOENAED
ON POLITICAL GIFT

HOUSTON, May 16 (AP)—
The Federal Government yesterday subpoenaed the bank records of the president of Gulf Resources & Chemical Company, Robert H. Allen, and recalled a Federal grand jury for a special session Friday in connection with a contribution to President Nixon's re-election campaign.

The jury is investigating possible criminal violations involving \$89,000, part of a \$100,000 contribution by Mr. Allen, who says he personally donated the money. Mr. Allen, who says he personally donated that the company contributed to the campaign.

It is unlawful for a corporation to contribute to a political campaign.

United States Attorney Henry J. Novak Jr. filed a subpoena showing that he had personally served the cashier of the First City National Bank with a demand for Mr. Allen's records, Federal court records revealed. Part of the contribution, \$89,000, was traced to a Miami bank account of Bernard L.
