The Charlotte Observer quoted sources yesterday as saying the White House tried, and failed, we months ago to enlist North Carolina Republi-cans in an effort to dis-credit Watergate investi-gator Senator Sam J. Er-vin Jr vin Jr.

Ervin is a North Carolina Democrat.

The Observer said in a dispatch from its Washington bureau that high officials in the North Carolina Republican party confirmed Wednesday that H. R. Haldeman made two attempts to enlist state GOP officials in an attempt to "dig up something" on Ervin.

The dispatch said:

"According to sources, Haldeman placed two phone calls to former White House aide Harry Dent and asked Dent to relay the suggestion to State Republican Chair-man Frank Pauge man Frank Rouse. "The GOP sources said

that Dent contacted Rouse, but that both men agreed that it was an unwise and improper suggestion. Noth-ing was ever done to carry

it out, the sources said. "It was not clear precisely what tactics Haldeman had in mind for the proposed moves against Ervin, chair-man of the Senate committee investigating the Water-
