—A Federal judge ordered four former White House-aides to-day to testify before Democratic National Committee lawyers in National Committee lawyers in

But Judge Charles R. Richey said that he would defer ruling on whether John Dean, the former White House counsel, must give a deposition to the committee's lawyers until the question of Mr. Dean's immunity from prosecution is resolved by the courts.

The Democratic National Committee filed a \$6.4-million civil suit against the Committee for the Re-Election of the President in connection with the Watergate burglary and wire-tapping.

H. R. Haldeman, the former White House chief of staff, and John D. Ehrlichman, the former Presidential assistant for domestic affairs, are now scheduled to give a deposition to the national committee on Tuesday. The judge also ordered Jeb Stuart Magruder and Herbert M. Porter to give full depositions to committee lawyers. Mr. Magruder, a Nixon campaign director, gave a partial deposition to the lawyers on May 1 and Mr. Porter, a former scheduling director for the Nixon re-election committee, appeared on May 14.
