## Hoffa Critical Of Watergate Investigation

Former Teamsters president James R. Hoffa said yesterday that the Watergate case belongs "in front of a grand jury and has nothing to do with legislative practices."

Hoffa criticized the sena-Hoffa criticized the sena-tors holding the hearing, saying they "are able to have a field day for their own purposes as they did with me . . . and I object to people being tricked into be-lieving that what's being said would be permissible in said would be permissible in a court."

Hoffa was in federal prison for over four years, convicted of jury tampering while being tried for the misuse of union money. He was freed when President Nixon granted executive clemency clemency.

Hoffa said many of the charges in the Watergate scandal "are based on hear-say evidence."
