The Voice of America is pulling no punches in its reporting of the Watergate scandal overseas and some members of the Senate are concerned about the candor.

An examination of news reports and commentaries

broadcast over the U.S. government's official radio in the last four months showed that the sensational Water-gate developments were re-

gate developments were reported openly and quickly.

The broadcasts refer unflinchingly to "the Watergate political spy scandal."

A May 10 report stated flatly: "Everyone agrees, including President Nixon, that some members of his administration have indulgdulged in abuses of the American political system."
