

Gov. Carter Doubts Nixon Will Quit or Be Impeached

RUSSELS, (UPI) — In a reference to the Watergate scandal, Gov. Jimmy Carter of Georgia, who heads a Democratic national campaign committee, said today that "the Nixon administration is doing my job for me right now."

But Mr. Carter, who is chairman of a unit that will map strategy for the 1974 Congressional and gubernatorial elections, said the Democratic leaders would not use the Watergate affair "for partisan advantage."

He expressed doubt that President Nixon would be impeached or would resign.

Governor Carter, who is on a tour of Europe and Israel, met today with the Belgian Finance Minister, Willy Declercq, and officials of Sabena, the Belgian airline. He is to go to Paris tomorrow.

The Governor said the Sabena-led European carriers in a bid to open up the Atlanta airport to overseas flights.
