New York Former Attorney Gen-eral Ramsey Clark said yesterday he doesn't know of any national security program under which breaking and entering for searches or photograph-ing documents was ausearches or photograph-ing documents was au-thorized by the Justice Department during the Kennedy and Johnson ad-ministrations. Hoover, FBI director when Clark was attorney general, on at least one occasion asked for such permission? but was turned down. But, Clark said, "I don't recall any program as such sub-mitted."

In his statement about the In his statement about the Watergate scandal yester-day, President Nixon said there was an attempt in 1970 to reinstitute "certain intel-licence operations, which ligence operations which

had been suspended in 1966. These in turn had included authorization for surrepti-tious entry - breaking and entering, in effect — on spe-cified categories of targets in specified situations relat-ed to national security." Hoover objected to the pro-gram and it was rejected, Mr. Nixon said.
