

No Evidence Of Political Gain

To the Editor:

Never in the annals of our nation has there been such a concerted and stupendous effort undertaken by political opportunists, the ultra liberal news media and other implacable haters of President Nixon to hound him out of public life, although I do not minimize the impropriety and illegality of the Watergate misadventure.
