Caulfield Resignation Accepted at Treasury

Associa Secretary of the Treasury George Schultz yesterday announced he is accepting the resignation from the Treasury Department of John J. Caulfield, who has testified that he offered ex-ecutive clemency to a Watergate defendant. Shultz said in a statement that he told Caulfield, "Your resignation is hereby ac-cepted, effective as of the close of business today." Treasury sources said Shultz requested Caulfield's resignation.

Caulfield had been assist-ant director for criminal en-forcement in the Bureau of

Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

He was placed on administrative leave with pay after his involvement with Water-gate burglar James W. Mc-Cord became known two weeks ago.

Caulfield, 44, acknowl-edged to the select Senate Watergate committee that before joining the Treasury Department he offered Mc-Cord executive clemency on instructions of then-White House counsel John Dean. He has said he thought President Nixon knew of the offer.
