

Caulfield's Resignation Is Accepted by Shultz

WASHINGTON, May 24 (AP)—Secretary of the Treasury George P. Shultz announced Thursday that he was accepting the resignation from the Treasury Department of John J. Caulfield, who has testified that he offered executive clemency to a Watergate defendant.

Mr. Shultz said in a statement that he had told Mr. Caulfield, "Your resignation is hereby accepted, effective as of the close of business today." Treasury sources said that Mr. Shultz had requested Mr. Caulfield's resignation. Mr. Caulfield had been assistant director for criminal enforcement in the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.
