**Tunney: 'Wait for Facts'**

Sen. John Tunney still thinks the American public should not presume President Nixon's guilt in the Watergate scandal until all the facts are in.

Several days before Nixon issued his lengthy statement indicating that he had earlier been informed of an Watergate coverup attempt — among other things — Tunney had urged that the

President be given the benefit of the doubt.

Yesterday, after the California Democrat's meeting here with North Coast fishermen, newsmen asked whether Tunney now thinks Nixon is guilty.

"We still have to wait until all the evidence is in," responded Tunney. "It does concern me very deeply as a citizen that he might be guilty," he added.
