Senate Staff Investigates

WASHINGTON, May 26 (AP)

—Senate investigators are using next week's recess in the televised Watergate hearings to study the Nixon Administration's gathering of intelligence on persons in and out of government.

Members of the Senate Watergate committee's staff questioned Assistant Attorney General A. William Olson Saturday about the operations of the Justice Department's internal security division.

James W. McCord Jr., convicted Watergate conspirator, has told the committee that a section head in that division gave him intelligence reports almost daily while McCord was security chief for the Committee for the Re-election of the President.
