In response to today's Washington Post story on President Nixon and Wa-tergate, White House press secretary issued the

following statement:
"The story reflects a shocking and irresponsible abuse of authority on the part of the federal prosecutors, if in fact they made the statements attributed to statements attributed to them. Grand jury proceedings are by law secret. It is a violation of law to communicate information and allegations relating to the grand jury proceedings in this fashion.

"The White House has asked Attorney General (Elliot P.) Richardson, and will be asking special prosecutor (Archibald) Cox, to investi-gate the circumstances of these anonymous charges against the President of the United States — and to do so immediately."
