Agnew said he was "proud to serve" under President Nixon, a remark which drew only scattered applause.

Agnew said the "vultures" were hoping to find a "corpse of the presidency" but that the "vultures" would be disappointed. "The President is alive and well and just as vig-orous as ever," Agnew said. He said it is "a good time"

to be a Republican now and that "I am just as proud of my party tonight as I was on the day I first registered. I know that all of you share that pride with me."

In referring to Watergate. Agnew said, "I do not attempt to assert that certain individuals are without falt or that the Watergate matter is a defensible lark. But I do state that the Republican Party is not involved, not indicted, and not responsible." This drew applause from the crowd.
