## Watergate Witnesses

## Washington

There are three witnesses scheduled to appear today when the Senate Watergate investigating committee reopens its televised hearings:

• Sally Harmony, the former secretary to G. Gordon Liddy, convicted Watergate conspirator who was formerly chief counsel for the Committee for the Re-election of the President. She reported-

ly typed the secret "Gemstone" reports based on the raw transcript of intercepted telephone conversations made to and from Democratic National Committee headquarters at the Watergate.

- H. A. Post, owner of a Washington printing company, who said his company printed "Gemstone" stationery.
  - Robert Reisner, an as-

sistant to Jeb Magruder who was the deputy director of the Nixon campaign.

Reisner's name was cited in previous Senate testimony by James W. McCord as one who might be able to support his story that the Watergate operation had the approval of Magruder, former U.S. Attorney General John N. Mitchell and former presidential counsef John W. Dean III. Associated Press
