SFExaminer JUN 1 0 1973 Indicted, Stans' Pay of \$60,000 Cut

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Maurice Stans has been drawing a salary from the Nixon campaign's \$4.8 million leftover fund, the Finance Committee to Re-elect the President announced yesterday.

Stans, who had intended to donate his services, was awarded retroactive pay at the rate of \$60,000 a year for the period starting April 7, 1972.

Stans voluntarily took a pay cut to \$30,000 a year May 10, when he was indicted in New York for perjury, fraud and obstruction of justice in connection with a campaign gift by Robert L. Vesco, accused of looting mutual funds.

SAN JOSE (Costa Rica)—
(AP) — The foreign ministry announced yesterday it received a petition from the U.S. government asking the extradition of fugitive financier Robert L. Vesco.

The petition was sent to the supreme court which will decide whether Vesco can be extradited to face various charges at home, officials said.

Sources said the court's decision is expected Monday.
