A Phone Tap

ROCKFORD (ILL.) — (AP)

— Rep. John B. Anderson says he believes his telephone may have been tapped at the time he fought against a wish of the Nixon Administration.

Anderson told newsmen he suspected a tap at his Maryland home occurred in April, 1969, when he argued against Administration attempts to water down the Voting Rights Act.

"My wife and I have been highly suspicious of the number of times a telephone repair truck stopped outside our home and linemen would climb the poles to work with the lines," the Illinois Republican said.
