Mr. Greenspun filed a motion in United States District Court seeking to quash a subpoena served by the I.R.S. ordering him to turn over the documents to the Government tomorrow. Judge Roger Foley did not sign an order immediately.

The motion to quash said the summons was in violation of the First Amendment, as well as Nevada statutes, which protect newspapers from disclosing sources.
