Stans Continues

Testifying at Today's Hearing

Former Commerce Secretary Maurice H. Stans will appear again today before the Senate Watergate investigating committee.

Chief Counsel Samuel Dash said he hoped but could not guarantee that the committee could finish questioning the chairman of the Finance Committee for the Re-election of the President by the end of the morning session.

Dash said Stans will be followed by Jeb Stuart Magruder, former deputy director of the Nixon campaign. He said the Magruder session would take at least two days.

Nixon Spending

'Little Time' On Watergate

Washington

President Nixon is spending "a very small percentage" of his time on Watergate developments, the White House said yesterday.

Deputy press secretary Gerald L. Warren, responding to questions, said Mr. Nixon receives summaries of the Senate Watergate hearings and other matters relating to the scandal.

Warren said most of the President's working hours recently have been devoted to decision-making on inflation and the eight-day visit of Soviet Communist party leader Leonid Brezhnev, which commences Monday.
