WASHINGTON, June 12—
E. Howard Hunt Jr., a Watergate conspirator who pleaded guilty, said he was attacked and robbed in the District of Columbia Jail Sunday night. Hunt was moved to the Arlington County Jail in Virginia yesterday.

"He was very shaken by the episode," said William O. Bittman, Hunt's lawyer. "He said his life was in danger and he asked me to get him out of the D. C. Jail."

"I understand it was about 107 degrees in the cell and Mr. Hunt had taken off his clothes and gone to sleep when the guards put another inmate in the cell," Mr. Bittman said.

"Mr. Hunt woke up and found the other man robbing him blind, taking his papers, notebooks and clothes," the Lawyer said.
