The treasurer of the "Salute to Ted Agnew" committee, sponsors of the affair, was Baltimore county businesman B. H. Wharton.

Wolff said the indictment will be served today and then made public

He said the investigation of the false list of 32 contributors to the gala will continue and that "more indictments against more individuals may be sought."
