
A Reputed Nixon Agent Asserts He Worked on McGovern Staff

LOUISVILLE, Ky., June 12 (Reuters)—A man named as a Nixon campaign undercover agent in testimony before the Senate Watergate committee said Tuesday that he had infiltrated the staff of Senator George McGovern, the Democratic Presidential candidate, at Miami Beach as a security adviser.

Michael W. McMinoway, a 26-year-old former Kentucky parole and probation officer, also said he worked last year as a volunteer in the organizations of Senators Edmund S. Muskie and Hubert H. Humphrey while on the Nixon campaign payroll.

Mr. McMinoway disclosed a part of his undercover role

after Herbert L. Porter told the Senate Watergate committee that he had authorized payments of \$6,000 to Mr. McMinoway.

Mr. Porter, scheduling director of the Nixon re-election committee, concluded his testimony before the Senate Watergate committee Tuesday by detailing the spending of \$69,000 for what he said was campaign sabotage.

Mr. McMinoway, who now works with his father in a private detective agency, said that he had mailed regular intelligence reports to a contact he knew as Roger Stone. He said that he presumed the reports were relayed to the Nixon campaign committee.
