United Press International Sen. Carl T. Curtis (R. Neb.) charged yesterday "publicity-seeking politi-cians" are out to "get Nix-on" in their pursuit of the watergate scandal. In a prepared Senate Speech, Curtis said Mr. Nixon was "totally innocent of any wrongdoing" in the scandal. "He didn't plot it. He didn't condone it. And the facts were withheld from him for too long after it happened." Without mentioning any mames, Curtis said Water-sate had "brought into be-ing a determined and mili-tant coalition whose object is not justice but rather to 'get Nixon'' despite the President's disclaimers of any prior knowledge. Curtis identified this group as: "The Nixon-haters, a group of politico-sadists, of the type who enjoyed their ef-forts to destroy Lyndon Johnson over the war issue. A small segment of news-men who prefer political propaganda over objective reporting, a few extreme partisans whose sense of justice is numbed by their desire for political gain, and those political any issue willing to exploit any issue for personal publicity."
