Fake Campaign Letter

Brings Term of a Year

TAMPA, Fla., June 15 (AP) — George Hearing received today a maximum one-year prison sentence on charges of distributing a fake letter in Florida in the Presidential campaign of 1972.

Hearing, 40 years old, was sentenced by United States State District Judge Ben Krentzman, who described the Tampa man's actions as "immoral."

An Orlando Federal grand jury had indicted Hearing, together with an alleged political saboteur, Donald H. Segretti, 28, a Los Angeles lawyer and Nixon campaign figure.

The two were accused of publishing and distributing a letter printed on the campaign letterhead of Senator Edmund S. Muskie of Maine and with conspiracy to distribute it.

The letter charged two of Mr. Muskie's primary opponents, Senator Henry H. Jackson of Washington and Senator Hubert H. Humphrey of Minnesota, with sexual misconduct.

Hearing pleaded guilty to one count of the two-count indictment. Mr. Segretti has entered a plea of not guilty.
