TAMPA, Fla., June 15, (AP) - Accountant George Hearing was given a maximum one year prison sentence today on charges of distributing a phony letter during the 1972 presidential campaign in Flo-

Hearing, 40, was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Ben Krentzman, who described the Tampa man's actions as "immoral."

An Orlando federal grand jury indicted Hearing, to-gether with alleged political

gether with alleged political saboteur Donald Segretti, 28, a Los Angeles attorney and Nixon campaign figure.

The two were accused of publishing and distributing a letter printed on the campaign letterhead of Sen. Edmund S. Muskie (D-Maine) and with conspiracy to distribute it.

The bogus letter charged two of Muskie's primary opponents, Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D-Wash.) and Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.) with sex-

Humphrey (D-Minn.) with sexual misconduct.

Hearing pleaded guilty to one count of the two-count indictment. Segretti has entered an innocent plea. The prosecution agreed to dismiss one of the counts against Hearing in return for his pleading guilty.
