## WXPost JUN 1 6 1973 **Sued Over Phone Tap**

Democratic Party official R. Spencer Oliver, on whose phone at the Democratic National Headquarters a wiretap was discovered, filed a \$5 million lawsuit yesterday against Nixon re-election campaign officials and others allegedly tied to the Watergate break-in.

The invasion of privacy and illegal wiretapping suit claims that the wiretapping and its aftermath have subjected Oliver to "total interruption of his normal daily activity, (through) ongoing questioning by law enforcement agencies and various and sundry investigative bodies."

The suit further claims that Oliver has been subjected to:

• Suggestions of complicity and collusion of the break-in itself.

• "Ugly innuendo" re-garding the tapped tele-phone conversations themselves.

selves. • Suggestions and accusa-tions that he had his own telephone bugged. • An unfortunate, con-scious or unconscious, effort by many of his peers to dis-associate themselves from, him becuase of his innocent connection with the Waterconnection with the Water-

Among the defendants named in yesterday's suit named in yesterday's suit are the Nixon campaign committee, the Finance Committee to Re-elect the President, former Cabinet members John N. Mitchell and Maurice Stans, the orig-inal seven Watergate de-fendants, former Nixon cam-paign official Jeb Stuart Ma-gruder, and former White House counsel John W. Dean III.
