E. Howard Hunt as A Thriller Writer?

BRIEFS: One of the Watergate spinoffs of the Watergate affair is the "unmasking" of Watergate ringleader E. Howard Hunt as a closet writer of thrillers. Publisher's Weekly reveals that Hunt is the author of some 40 thrillers published under several pseudonyms (a few under his own name), and that Putnam's is rushing this newest, a spy story titled "The Berlin Ending," for publication in August.
