**WHITE HOUSE DENIES  
WATERGATE REPORT**

WASHINGTON, June 18 — The White House stated today that no one with authority or access to the facts had said that President Nixon was preparing to say he was misled in the Watergate case by two former aides, John D. Ehrlichman and H. R. Haldeman.

The statement was in response to an article published in The Washington Post this morning, saying the President was preparing another defense position on Watergate in which

he would attribute misjudgments on his part to misinformation and unauthorized action on the part of Mr. Haldeman and Mr. Ehrlichman.

"Anonymous White House sources quoted by The Washington Post do not have access to the facts and do not speak with authority either for the President or for the White House staff working on the Watergate matter," said Gerald L. Warren, deputy White House press secretary. "We have previously pointed out the extreme unfairness, to all parties, of such 'source' stories and we reiterate that position."
