Former Attorney General John N. Mitchell was ordered by State Supreme Court Justice Birdle Amsterdam yesterday to answer questions about whether he leaked Federal Bureau of Investigation and

Justice Amsterdam acted on a request from Rudolph Papales brother-in-law of Mayor Joseph L. Alioto of San Francisco. Mr. Papale is suing for libel writers Richard Carlson and Lance Brisson, as well as Cowles Communications, publishers of the now-defunct Look Magazine.

Mr. Mitchell's testimony is to be given at 10 A.M. July 2 at 60 East 42d Street, in the offices of James V. Joy Jr., a New by ork attorney representing Mr. Papale, who lives in California.

Mitchell activated the massive simultaneous disclosure by five Federal investigative agencies reporting a number of Mafian members to the Look authors, who were trying the link them to the Mayor and his brother-in-law."
